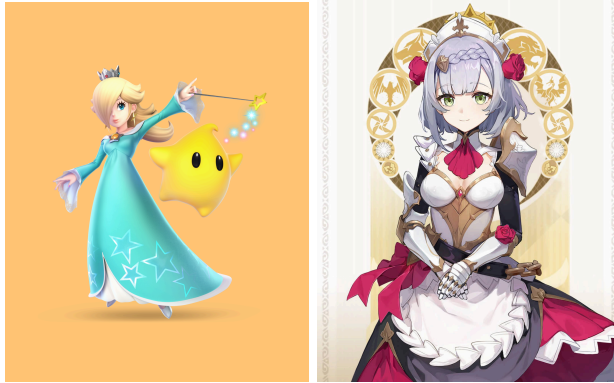

Since 2013, Ms. Smith has lent her voice to Rosalina, the Comet Observatory guardian from Nintendo's Super Mario series. She has also voiced Kana from Fire Emblem, Noelle from Genshin Impact and Death from Granblue Fantasy Versus: Rising. The voice actress also took part in the popular anime JoJo's Bizarre Adventure: Stone Ocean. In addition to her dubbing activities, Laura Faye Smith has also appeared in several series as an actress.
